## Changes to Breakfast Club from September 2024

For a long time we have been able to run breakfast club as a free provision for children. As you will be well aware, the financial climate is very challenging at this time. In addition to this, we now have a larger proportion of working families with children attending our school, meaning we get less 'pupil premium' funding.

There have also been changes to legislation around the supervision of under 5s. The legislation now requires us to have a level 3 or higher qualified member of staff who also has a current paediatric first aid certificate present with our younger children. This has meant changes to our supervision arrangements at lunchtime and impacts breakfast club. Lastly, for a while now we have had requests from parents for places for nursery age children in our breakfast club. From September 2024, our 'Rise and Shine' before school childcare provision will replace breakfast club and it will take all ages of children, including nursery, but will become a chargeable provision costing £5 per child per day. There will be a level 3 member of staff in the provision each day and fees will be payable in advance. The provision will be staffed by existing school staff. Sign up arrangements will be shared with parents after half term but we envisage there being enough places for all those wanting to attend. In September, all children will continue to be offered free toast every day and so no child will ever be without a breakfast.

There will be no change for the remainder of this school year.

We know that this change may be difficult for families but it is totally unavoidable. It been discussed at length and agreed by senior leaders and by governors.
